CHILDREN OF NEPAL 11 – 18 NOVEMBER 2016

On behalf of Awful Grace (AG) and Victim Support & Rehabilitation Program (VSRP), we're delighted to present the report on the successful completion of the second mission trip to Nepal. This was a follow on from the 2015 trip which was to address immediate needs of the earthquake of April 2015. As a consequence of fuel rationing on that 2015 trip, two of the planned villages were not visited. This 2016 trip was to fulfil our commitment to the people of Nepal.

In all, 350 children were engaged across three locations, with therapeutic and learning activities, as well as the provision primary healthcare like health check-ups, dispensing of vitamins, deworming tablets, eye drops, toothpaste, tooth brushes, shampoo and soap. These children were also prepared to return to school with the distribution of school backpack s and school supplies like uniforms, shoes, writing pads, pencils.

An added bonus was the serendipitous opportunity to visit Bhimphedi Prison and establish a medical clinic which served 190 prisoners and children of prisoners. Diabetes and high blood pressure were amongst the ailment attended to and medicines dispensed.

Planned well and with no agenda but the engagement as equals as an expression of our common humanity, there was mutual beneficence. The line between donor and volunteer and recipient, were blurred. Who gave and who received? All did!

This was beautifully expressed by one of our volunteers, 12-year old Trisha, who communicated with the children without words, in the construction of the windmills. A new paradigm of mission-enabling-engagement is the transcending of culture, language, status, wealth, poverty, even age. Our common humanity meant that even the most obvious differences were of little consequence.

Another key outcome is the nurturing of community spirit by the recipients themselves. In Chitwan, when we introduced the games, we witnessed the transformation of the children from being reticent to participate, to, by the end of the day, not only having loads of fun, but that it overflowed and the children dragged their caregivers into the game! The line between donor and volunteer and recipient, were blurred.

Who gave and who received? As we plan for a third trip in fulfilment of our 3-year promise to the people of Nepal, one of the most significant outcomes is the decision to focus with great intentionality on community development, instead of just mobile clinics and distribution of school material (which has been done the last two years). Rather, as we conclude the 3-year mission programme in 2017, our desire at Awful Grace is to engage in community development and to catalyse the creation of self-sustaining initiatives to lift the villagers out of their poverty cycle. OBJECTIVES

Children of Nepal is a project which started in 2015 and will continue as we journey with the people of Nepal to restore broken communities and bring hope to the families and children. It is a collaborative partnership between Awful Grace (AG) and Victim Support & Rehabilitation Programme (VSRP) and the people of Singapore.

This year, nine volunteers from Singapore arrived on November II, 2016 in Kathmandu. Of the nine, more than half were new to Nepal, including two 12-year olds and a 17-year old. Together with more than 25 Nepali volunteers stationed in Kathmandu, Chitwan and Dhading, we were excited to begin our work. An intense period of planning preceded the trip.

On the first day, we visited a local church and the Peace Loving Children Home in Gothathar (Kathmandu), where more than 150 children and caregivers gathered for medical screening and school materials distribution. School bags, essentials such as soap, shampoo, school uniforms and stationery, were distributed to the children. We travelled to Chitwan the next three days and ran the mobile clinic at the Prison in Bhimphedi and for the villagers in Chitwan and Dhading. In total about 580 people went through the health screening with about 350 children receiving the school bags and essential supplies.

Dr. Priscilla Ang, Dr. Robin Jung, and Dr. Raj Datta conducted the medical clinics, with support from the team of Singapore and Nepali volunteers coordinating the distribution of bags, and facilitating activities for the children.

- 3. 30 volunteers and staff of Victim Support & Rehabilitation Program (VSRP) were involved in the activities


